### Swimmers Dive Into New Season

As the 2002-2003 season begins, **Mike Anderson** is looking forward to seeing how much his players have improved after his first year as Head Coach. The University of Hawai'i swimmers begin their season this Friday at the first Senior Circuit. They will be competing against swimmers from around the state in a non-scoring competition at the Duke Kahanamoku Aquatic Complex starting at 6:00 PM.

UH compete in their first scoring meet of the season versus the **University of the Pacific** next Friday, October 18, at 6:00 PM. Last season, both UOP teams captured Big West Titles at their league's championships.

### Rainbows to Watch...

According to second year head coach **Mike Anderson** the University of Hawai'i Women's swimming and diving team will do well this season, with the addition of two world-class Chinese athletes and a strong returning class, UH is positioned to become one of the fastest improving teams in the country. **YingJuan Zhen**, one of two world-class Chinese swimming recruits is world ranked in the 100 and 200 back stroke events. When she was 17 she missed the world record by 1/10 of a second. **Yan Chen**, the second world-class Chinese swimmer is world ranked in the 200-butterfly. She is also the former world record holder in the Individual Medley competition.

The Rainbow Wahine have four divers on this year's squad. The team is led by WAC Diver-of-the-Year **Maggie Roberts**. Roberts won the 1-meter diving title at the WAC Championships.

With a men's team that is 50 percent new, Head Coach **Mike Anderson** is very excited to see a stronger squad with quality and depth emerge in the 2002-03 season. Returning for the men is **Cheyne Bloch**, a junior who last season broke the NIC and pool record at the league championships in the 100 and 200 breaststroke events. Also returning is junior **Mike Gowdy**, a diver who last year captured first place in the 1-meter, third place in the 3-meter and second overall in the 10-meter platform at the NIC championships.

This year also saw changes in the coaching staff for UH swimming and diving. **JiaLin Sun** was promoted to a full time assistant coach. **Chris Mooney** has joined the staff as a full time assistant. **David Struthers** and **Carrie Manhart** are the newest members of the coaching staff as graduate assistants.

### About the Duke Kahanamoku Aquatic Complex...

The facility consisting of a 50-meter training pool and a separate 25-yard competition and diving pool houses the swimming and diving teams and the women's water polo team. It also hosts the Hawai'i High School Athletic Association's Swimming Championships and the aquatic competitions of the Hawai'i State Games.

The diving pool is one of the fastest in the country with eight-foot and six-foot wide lanes and a depth of 15 feet. Two 1-meter and 3-meter springboards and three platform towers at heights of five, seven-and-a-half, and 10-meters decorate the diving pool. The DKAC also houses a hot tub and an underwater viewing room.

The DKAC was first constructed in 1978 with additional renovations in 1986.
