Season Outlook

Last season marked one of the most successful seasons in Wahine basketball history. Hawai'i won 26 games and went further into the post-season than any other team in school history, advancing to the semifinals of the Women's National Invitation Tournament. Head coach Vince Goo's squad will try to ride the momentum into this season minus three of its top scorers and nearly two-thirds of its offense from last year. Forwards **Crystal Lee** and **Kylie Galloway** and center **Dainora Puida** are gone. The Wahine have eight letterwinners and three starters returning who will be looked upon to step up offensively.

Two other factors will weigh heavily upon the team's fate.

"I think the team has to play with a lot of chemistry," Goo said. "When you've got good chemistry, they are going to play for one another and play together as a unit."

Defense was another key to last year's success as UH was among the national leaders in scoring and field goal percentage defense.

Goo believes the most depth will be at point guard. Senior **Janka Gabrielova** (5-6, Sr., Bratislava, Slovakia) returns as the starter. The junior college transfer from Weatherford (Texas) College, earned all-WAC newcomer and all-WNIT honors last season, while leading the team in assists (4.0) and steals (1.5). Goo is confident in the capabilities of Gabrielova's two backups at point—junior **Michelle Gabriel** (5-5, Jr., Kailua, Oahu) and highly touted freshman **Milia Macfarlane** (5-5, Fr., Honolulu).

The Wahine have a mixture of youth and experience at the wing positions. Senior **Karena Greeny** (5-11, Sr., Port Angeles, WA), is the veteran of the bunch entering her fifth year in the program. Greeny played in all 34 games last year, starting the first five games. **April Atuaia** (5-10, So., Laie, Oahu) and **Christa Brossman** (5-10, So., Pullman, WA) also return after making substantial contributions as true freshmen. Atuaia became the fifth Wahine to earn conference freshman of the year honors after an outstanding campaign in which she started the final 29 games of the season. Brossman, who played in all but two games last year, is the best conditioned athlete on the team and one of the squad's best defenders. Freshman **Chelsea Wagner** (5-10, Fr., Springfield, OR) enters the program with impressive credentials as a high school All-American and Oregon's state player of the year last season.

The Wahine boast versatility at the post. Power forward **Natasja Allen** (6-2, Jr., Port Orchard, WA), who came on strong in UH's postseason run last season, returns for her junior season. Also at power forward is **Julia Washington** (6-0, So., Glendora, CA) who seems to finally be healthy after battling foot and knee injuries during her first two years in the program. Two newcomers could pay early dividends for the Wahine. Redshirt freshman **Jade Abele** (6-0, Fr., Gold Coast, Australia) will spend most of her time in the post, but can play both forward positions. Newcomer **Arijana Sijeric** (6-2, Jr., Sarajevo, Bosnia), a transfer from New Mexico Junior College, can play both the four and five spots.

The Wahine have only one true center—but an imposing one in that in junior **Christen Roper** (6-5, Jr., Ojai, CA). Last season Roper set a new school and WAC single-season record with 96 blocks and finished sixth in the nation in blocks per game (2.8). She also added 5.4 ppg and 5.9 rpg. Goo expects an even bigger season this year from his starting center.

UH will be tested early as the Wahine will face a steady stream of competition. Teams from the Big Ten, Big 12 and Pac-10 will participate in the Waikiki Beach Marriott Resort Classic, the Hawai'i Invitational, the Ala Moana Hotels Paradise Classic and the 23rd Annual Rainbow Wahine Classic. Top 25 teams Baylor, Penn State and Stanford highlight the schedule.

The complexion of the Western Athletic Conference changes drastically with the addition of Louisiana Tech. The national power brings instant credibility to the league and with all five of its starters returning from last season, the Lady Techsters will be a national title contender.

Wahine Roll Past New Zealand in Exhibition

The University of Hawai'i Wahine basketball team used a balanced attack to defeat the New Zealand Tall Ferns, 74-52, in an exhibition game Saturday at the Stan Sheriff Center. All Wahine saw playing time in the preseason game but it was two freshmen who stepped up and took control for the Wahine. Guard **Chelsea Wagner** and forward **Jade Abele** combined for 33 points, 27 of which came on

3-pointers. Wagner topped the scoring for the Wahine with 20 points, hitting 6-of-9 from behind the arc. Abele chipped in 13 points on 3-of-4 3-point shots, while also adding six rebounds. Two other Wahine scored in double figures as senior **Karena Greeny** poured in 12 points and junior **Natasja Allen** had 11. Both teams struggled from the field in the exhibition with the Wahine shooting 37 percent and New Zealand just 31 percent. UH, however, did manage to hit 12 of its 28 3-point attempts. Junior center **Christen Roper** led the defensive effort for UH with a team-high 11 rebounds and four blocks.

**Home Sweet Home**

Since moving into the Stan Sheriff Center in 1994, Hawai'i has won 75 percent of its home games (96-32) and 80 percent of its conference games (44-11). The Wahine are currently riding an eight-game home win streak.

**Up Next**

Hawai'i hosts the 23rd Annual Panda Travel Rainbow Wahine Classic, November 23-25. Joining the Wahine are Florida Atlantic, Minnesota, Oklahoma State, Penn State, Stanford, Weber State and Wyoming.

The Cougars finished 11-17 last year with a ninth place finish in the Pac-10...eight letter-winners and four seniors return to this year, including center **Brittney Hawks** the leading returning scorer (8.9 ppg) and rebounder (5.2 rpg)...like Hawai'i, WSU lost its top three scorers from last season, although none of them averaged more than 10 points a game...the Cougars defeated Mirabel Banska Bystrica (Slovakia), 68-34, in an exhibition game Saturday...WSU was led by freshman **Francine McCurtain's** 15 points...head coach **Jenny Przekwas** is in her third season at WSU where she is 15-41. Her career record is 148-140 in 10 seasons.

The Aggies return nine letterwinners and three starters but will be counting on a trio of junior college transfer to make an immediate impact, including all-state guard **Rhonda Cooper**...the Aggies defeated Abyhoj (Denmark), 72-53, in exhibition on Nov. 6 .....head coach **Peggie Gillom** is in her fifth year with the Aggies and holds a 30-52 school and career record.

**Scouting Portland State**



The Vikings suffered through a rash of injuries and the loss of four starters to graduation to finish last season 4-24 and in eighth place in the Big Sky...the Vikings return seven letterwinners and three starters from last year...junior guard **Nikki Pettigrew** is the top returning scorer at 9.3 ppg...Portland State fell to Western Oregon, 65-55, Saturday in an exhibition...**Sarah Hedgepeth** led the Vikings with 19 points and 15 rebounds.....Head coach **George Wolfe**, a former assistant to Hawai'i head coach Vince Goo for more than a decade, is in his second season at PSU where he is 13-42.

Vince Goo is in his 15th season as head coach of the University of Hawai'i women's basketball team. With a 287-124 record, Goo is the winningest coach in Wahine basketball history. Goo has brought the Wahine basketball program to unprecedented success, notching 20-plus win seasons in eight of the last 10 seasons. During his tenure, the Wahine have captured three regular-season conference titles and five NCAA Tournament and three WNIT bids. In 1998 he was named the WAC Pacific Division Coach-of-the-Year after guiding the Wahine to the WAC Pacific Division title and an NCAA Tournament berth. He was also named Big West Coach-of-the-Year in 1989, '93 and '94. The former high school teacher has also molded Wahine players into winners off the court. Goo boasts a 100 percent graduation rate among the more than 30 players who have completed their eligibility at UH.
