Wahine Play First of Four Straight Road Games

This Week

The Western Athletic Conference plot thickens as the University of Hawai'i Rainbow Wahine basketball hits the road for four straight road games. The Wahine improved to 6-2 in the WAC with a 69-53 win over Fresno State on Saturday and are in third place behind 7-2 Rice. UH's first road opponent, San Jose State is close behind the Wahine at 6-3 in conference. The Spartan contest begins a four-game stretch of games to be played in seven days.

Goo Captures 300th Career Victory

Head coach **Vince Goo** reached a milestone on Saturday, January 26, picking up his 300th career win with a 69-53 decision over Fresno State. Goo, who took over the reins at UH during the 1987-88 season, holds a 300-128 (.701) record in his 15th year as head coach. Goo picked up his 100th win on December 13, 1992 vs. Santa Clara and his 200th in a win over Rice in the quarterfinals of the WAC Tournament on March 5, 1997. Goo began this season with 287 wins. His teams have averaged 20.5 wins per season.

Atuaia Sidelined

Sophomore April Atuaia has been diagnosed with a torn anterior cruciate and is out indefinitely. She will miss UH's next four road games and will be re-evaluated upon the team's return. The 5-10 guard suffered the injury just three minutes into Saturday's 69-53 home win over Fresno State. Prior to her injury the reigning WAC Freshman of the Year proved to be the most versatile player on the team. She averaged 8.2 ppg and was second on the team in rebounds (7.1 rpg), assists (3.8 apg) and steals (13) through 16 games.

Given the Green(y) Light

Senior wing player and team captain **Karena Greeny** will carry a heavier burden with running mate April Atuaia out but she has shown her mettle by being a big part of UH's current three game win streak. The native of Port Angeles, Wash., has scored in double digits in each of the last three games, all convincing wins by UH. Greeny tallied 13 points, six rebounds and three assists in a 65-51 win at Tulsa. She followed a 10-point, eight rebound game versus Nevada (Jan. 24) with a career-game against Fresno State (Jan. 26). Greeny led the way in UH's 69-53 win over the Bulldogs, recording her second double-double of the season with 18 points and 13 rebounds.

Crashing the Boards

Rebounding has been one of the keys to UH's success thus far. Hawaii has out-rebounded 14 of 17 opponents and are 13-1 when holding an advantage on the boards. The Wahine currently rank second in the WAC and 14th in the nation in rebound margin at +8.1. Junior center **Christen Roper** (8.1 rpg) and sophomore guard **April Atuaia** (6.7 rpg) led the way on the glass.

Winning at the Line

UH has made a living on the line, where the Wahine have nearly doubled the amount of free throw attempts of their opponents. UH has gone to the line 427 times, an average of 25.1 per game. Their opponents meanwhile have averaged 12.6 attempts per game. The Wahine have in fact made more free throws than their opponents have attempted (292-215). They have also continued to stay out of foul trouble, with only three disqualifications this season and four in the last 51 contests.

Bombs Away

Janka Gabrielova has become one of the most dangerous 3-point threats in the Western Athletic Conference. Gabrielova leads the team with 29 this season and is second in the league in 3-point accuracy (.403). The senior point guard has at least one 3-pointer in 13 of 17 games. Her 1.7 per game rate puts her on pace to break the single season school record of 48 set by **Kylie Page** during the 1997-98 season. Gabrielova already is in the UH record books having tied a record with six 3-pointers made at UTEP last season. She ranks eighth on the all-time list (60) although playing in just 51 career games.

Return to Sender

Junior **Christen Roper** has continued to dominate the paint defensively. The 6-5 center, who set a school and conference single-season record of 96 blocks last season, is again putting up her best defense with 52 blocks through 17 games. Her 3.1 bpg ranks second in conference and sixth in the nation. She already tied a school-

record with seven blocks in the season-opener vs. Washington State (Nov. 17) and became the school's all-time leader in blocked shots against Baylor (Dec. 7) five games later. While **Nani Cockett** (1994, '96-98) set the mark of 140 in 120 career games, Roper shattered the record in just 62 contests. She now has a career total of 170.

Tenacious D

The Wahine, among the national leaders in defense last season, are again putting the clamps down on their opponents. UH is allowing just 57.6 points per game (17th in the nation) and have held its opponents to just 33.5 percent shooting from the floor (2nd in the nation). Just one opponent in the last 56 games has shot 50 percent against UH (New Mexico, March 24, 2001). Even in defeat the Wahine put out a solid defensive effort. Stanford defeated UH 71-60, but shot just 39 percent and was held scoreless by the Wahine for more than 10 minutes in the first half.

Going Postal

Hawai'i's opponents have found the going tough in the post. The Wahine frontcourt combination of **Natasja Allen** and **Christen Roper** have come up huge on both ends of the court. Allen is averaging a team-best 13.0 ppg and adding 5.8 rpg. Roper is second on the team with 11.1 ppg and is first in rebounds at 8.3 per game. Roper was named MVP of the Waikiki Beach Marriott Resort Classic and Ala Moana Hotel Paradise Classic after leading the Wahine to the championship. She was also named WAC Player of the Week on December 28. Allen, meanwhile, earned all-tournament honors in all four of UH's preseason tourneys and has scored in double figures in 14 of 17 games this year.

Protecting the Lead

A strength of the Wahine basketball team has been its ability to put teams away. The Wahine are 34-4 the last two seasons when leading at halftime, including a perfect 13-0 record this season. Conversely, the Wahine are 0-4 when trailing at halftime this year.

'Bows in the Polls

Hawai'i received nine votes in the latest ESPN/USA Today Coaches' Poll and four votes in the latest Associated Press Poll.

RPI Ratings

Hawai'i ranks 42nd (strength of schedule #86) by CollegeRpi.com and 41st (strength of schedule #85) by *Collegiate Basketball News* in the latest RPI ratings. The Wahine are ranked 43rd (strength of schedule #114) by WBCA/Summerville.

Home Sweet Home

Since moving into the Stan Sheriff Center in 1994, Hawai'i has won 75 percent of its home games (107-35) and 80 percent of its conference games (48-12). The Wahine held an 11-game home win streak until falling to Stanford, November 24.

Road Warriors

The Wahine are 28-12 (.700) in Western Athletic Conference regular season road games since joining the league in 1996-97.

Top-Notch Schedule

Hawai'i has faced three ranked teams during its regular season schedule and have hung tough against all of them. The Wahine lost its first matchup with a ranked team when it fell to **Stanford** (then AP No. 8, Coaches' No. 7), 71-60, in the semifinals of the Rainbow Wahine Classic. The Wahine trailed by as many as 19 in the game but went on a 21-0 run to go ahead of the Cardinal before the half. The game was knotted halfway through the second half, until Stanford pulled away. UH also presented a challenge for **Baylor** (then AP No. 9, Coaches' No. 13) in the Tesoro Invitational on Dec. 7. The Wahine trailed by just two points at half and led by as many as three points in the second half, before falling, 60-55. In a conference matchup up on January 13, UH lost to **Louisiana Tech** (then AP No. 11, Coaches' No. 13), 67-55. Before facing the Wahine, the Lady Techsters average margin of victory in the WAC was near 40 points. UH came within nine points in the second half and held Louisiana Tech 25 points below its conference scoring average.

Up Next

Hawai'i continues its road trip with games at Louisiana Tech (February 7, 6 p.m. CST) and at SMU (February 9, 2 p.m. MST).

Scouting San Jose State

The Spartans are on a roll having won four of their last five games to improve to 6-3 in the WAC...their only loss in the last five games was at Rice, 78-68 on January 19...the Spartans have the second-best scoring offense in WAC play at 70.3 ppg...point guard **Cricket Williams** is the league's top scorer at 18.9 ppg in WAC games...backcourt mate **Atari Parker** averages 15.0 ppg in the WAC, while senior forward **Elea A'Giza** averages 15.7 ppg and 8.1 rpg...head coach **Janice Richard** is in her third season at San Jose State where she is 27-47. Her career record is 186-81 in nine seasons.

Series History

Hawai'i leads the series 30-5 and has won 13 of the last 14 meetings. The teams last met January 5 in Honolulu with UH winning, 81-67.

The Miners have lost their last six games and are 3-13 overall and 1-7 in the WAC...UTEP's lone WAC win came in 76-73 upset at SMU on January 3...UTEP plays Louisiana Tech and SMU this week before facing UH next Monday...head coach **Keitha Green** is in her first season at UTEP, after compiling a 127-37 record in five seasons as a head coach at Independence (Kansas) Community College...the Miners top two scorers are Independence transfers, guard **Kimya Murray** (16.0 ppg) and wing player **Dragana Zoric** (13.5 ppg)...the two account for nearly half of the team's offense.

Head Coach Vince Goo

Vince Goo is in his 15th season as head coach of the University of Hawai'i women's basketball team. With a 300-128 record, Goo is the winningest coach in Wahine basketball history.

Goo has brought the Wahine basketball program to unprecedented success, notching 20-plus win seasons in eight of the last 10 seasons. During his tenure, the Wahine have captured three regular-season conference titles and five NCAA Tournament and three WNIT bids.

In 1998 he was named the WAC Pacific Division Coach-of-the-Year after guiding the Wahine to the WAC Pacific Division title and an NCAA Tournament berth. He was also named Big West Coach-of-the-Year in 1989, '93 and '94.

The former high school teacher has also molded Wahine players into winners off the court. Goo boasts a 100 percent graduation rate among the more than 30 players who have completed their eligibility at UH. Last season, five Wahine made the WAC All-Academic Team.
