All-WAC Honors

Seniors point guard **Janka Gabrielova** was the sole Rainbow Wahine to earn all-conference honors when she was named to the all-WAC second team in a vote by conference coaches. The native of Bratislava, Slovakia led the team in conference scoring (10.2 ppg) and assists (4.7 apg), the latter stat good for fourth in the WAC. She is also the team leader in 3-pointers made (43) and free throw percentage (.780).

Aloha Seniors

Seniors **Janka Gabrielova** and **Karena Greeny** will made their final home appearance against Boise State. Gabrielova was inserted as the starting point guard upon her arrival from Weatherford (Texas) College two years ago and has been the team's floor general ever since, starting 61 straight games. She was an all-WAC newcomer last year and earned second-team honors this season. With 43 3-pointers, she is on pace to break the school's single-season record for 3-pointers and ranks seventh all-time with 74 treys in her career. Greeny, who has been in the program for five seasons, is enjoying her best season as a Rainbow Wahine. She earned team captain honors as the season began and has put up career numbers in every statistical category this season. The native of Port Angeles, Wash., is averaging 9.3 ppg and 6.1 rpg and is second on the team with three double-doubles this season. Greeny has been phenomenal from 3-point range leading the WAC in 3-point percentage (.450), including a sizzling .524 in conference games. The 5-11 forward also leads the team in minutes.

Twentysomething

The Rainbow Wahine earned their 13th 20-win season in the program's history with a 66-48 win over UTEP February 28. Eleven of those seasons have come under current head coach **Vince Goo**. It also marked UH's third straight 20-win season and sixth in the last seven years. The Rainbow Wahine earned two NCAA Tournament and two WNIT bids in the previous six years.

Heavy Rotation

Team depth is essential for a winning team, especially down the stretch, and UH has begun to flex its reserve muscle. The Rainbow Wahine went to its bench early and often at Fresno State (Feb. 24) and it paid off. The UH reserves played nearly half the team's minutes to key a 66-47 win. **Christa Brossman** scored a season-high 14 points and **Kim Willoughby** grabbed a game-high 11 rebounds. **Jade Abele** chipped in with eight points and two blocks. Willoughby leads the UH bench at 6.1 and 5.1 rpg, while Brossman and **Michelle Gabriel** have proven to be the most durable and dependable reserves, each appearing in all 27 games this season.

Wagner Stepping it Up

Freshman Chelsea Wagner has started to shine in a starting role. Wagner was thrust into the starting slot following April Atuaia's injury against Fresno State on January 26. In 10 starts the 5-10 guard has averaged 13.3 ppg, 3.8 rpg and 1.7 apg. Wagner has particularly gotten it going from the outside. Against UTEP, she hit 5-of-10 on 3-pointers en route to a game-high 17 points. In UH's next game at Louisiana Tech the freshman showed no fear whatsoever against the seventh-ranked team in the nation. She scored a game-high 18 points and set a new individual school record with 12 3-point attempts. She hit four of those attempts versus the Lady Techsters and has made 21 3-pointers in her 10 starts. Against Tulsa (Feb. 14), the freshman stole the show, scoring a career-high 21 points, including eight straight late in the game to help secure a 62-53 win. She added 13 points and a career-high nine rebounds three days later versus Rice while playing all 40 minutes.

Got Balance?

Hawaii is showcasing one of its most balanced offensive attacks ever this season. Eight different players have scored in double figures at least once this year, while seven different players have led the team in scoring. Two players are averaging in double figures this season led by Natasja Allen's 11.6 ppg. Seven players on the squad are averaging nearly six points or more with only an average of 5.5 points separating the team's top scorer and the seventh leading scorer.

Tenacious D

The Wahine, among the national leaders in defense last season, are again putting the clamps down on their opponents. UH is allowing just 57.3 points per game (17th

Going Postal

Hawai'i's opponents have found the going tough in the post. The Wahine frontcourt combination of **Natasja Allen** and **Christen Roper** have come up huge on both ends of the court. Allen is averaging a team-best 11.6 ppg and adding 6.0 rpg. Roper is third on the team with 9.7 ppg and is first in rebounds at 7.4 per game. Roper, who leads the team with five double-doubles, was named MVP of the Waikiki Beach Marriott Resort Classic and Ala Moana Hotel Paradise Classic after leading the Wahine to the championship. She was also named WAC Player of the Week on December 28. Allen, meanwhile, earned all-tournament honors in all four of UH's preseason tourneys and has scored in double figures in 19 of 27 games this year.

Protecting the Lead

A strength of the Wahine basketball team has been its ability to put teams away. The Wahine are 40-5 the last two seasons when leading at halftime, including a stellar 19-1 record this season. Conversely, the Wahine are 2-5 when trailing at halftime this year. UH lost its first halftime lead (21-16) of the year when it fell, 55-54, to Rice on February 17.

Goo Captures 300th Career Victory

Head coach **Vince Goo** reached a milestone on Saturday, January 26, picking up his 300th career win with a 69-53 decision over Fresno State. Goo, who took over the reins at UH during the 1987-88 season, holds a 308-130 (.703) record in his 15th year as head coach. Goo picked up his 100th win on December 13, 1992 vs. Santa Clara and his 200th in a win over Rice in the quarterfinals of the WAC Tournament on March 5, 1997. Goo began this season with 287 wins. His teams have averaged 20.5 wins per season.

Injury Update

April Atuaia is likely out for the rest of the season with an ACL injury. She had missed nine of UH's last 10 games after suffering a torn left ACL in UH's 69-53 home win over Fresno State on January 26. The sophomore returned to action briefly at Fresno State (Feb. 21), logging in five minutes, but reaggravated her knee the next day in practice. Prior to her injury the reigning WAC Freshman of the Year proved to be the most versatile player on the team. She averaged 8.2 ppg and was second on the team in rebounds (7.1 rpg), assists (3.8 apg) and steals (13) through 16 games.

RPI Ratings

Hawai'i ranks 45th (strength of schedule #121) by CollegeRpi.com and 40th (strength of schedule #130) by *Collegiate Basketball News* in the latest RPI ratings. The Wahine are ranked 40th (strength of schedule #124) by WBCA/Summerville.

Home Sweet Home

Since moving into the Stan Sheriff Center in 1994, Hawai'i has won 75 percent of its home games (110-36) and 79 percent of its conference games (51-13). The Wahine held an 11-game home win streak until falling to Stanford, November 24.

Road Warriors

The Wahine are 33-13 (.717) in Western Athletic Conference regular season road games since joining the league in 1996-97, including 7-2 this season.

Top-Notch Schedule

Hawai'i has faced three ranked teams during its regular season schedule and have hung tough against all of them. The Wahine lost its first matchup with a ranked team when it fell to **Stanford** (then AP No. 8, Coaches' No. 7), 71-60, in the semifinals of the Rainbow Wahine Classic. The Wahine trailed by as many as 19 in the game but went on a 21-0 run to go ahead of the Cardinal before the half. The game was knotted halfway through the second half, until Stanford pulled away. UH also presented a challenge for **Baylor** (then AP No. 9, Coaches' No. 13) in the Tesoro Invitational on Dec. 7. The Wahine trailed by just two points at half and led by as many as three points in the second half, before falling, 60-55. In a conference matchup up on January 13, UH lost to **Louisiana Tech** (then AP No. 11, Coaches' No. 13), 67-55. Before facing the Wahine, the Lady Techsters average margin of victory in the WAC was near 40 points. UH came within nine points in the second half and held Louisiana Tech 25 points below its conference scoring average. The rematch on Feb. 7 was not as close as the Lady Techsters defeated the Wahine 83-54 in Ruston, La.

in the nation) and have held its opponents to just 34.8 percent shooting from the floor (9th in the nation). Just one opponent in the last 66 games has shot 50 percent against UH (New Mexico, March 24, 2001). Even in defeat the Wahine put out a solid defensive effort. Stanford defeated UH 71-60, but shot just 39 percent and was held scoreless by the Wahine for more than 10 minutes in the first half.

Clear Connection

UH have been lighting it up from the outside this season. The Rainbow Wahine set a new school record by nailing 15 3-pointers in an 89-66 win at UTEP (Feb. 4). Hawaii shattered the old mark of 11 set last season in a 72-66 overtime loss to TCU (Jan. 5, 2001). The 29 attempts against the Miners also tied a school-record set in 1999 in a 71-66 loss to New Mexico. In UH's next game against No. 7 Louisiana Tech, freshman **Chelsea Wagner** set a new individual school record with 12 3-point attempts. The Rainbow Wahine also made 8-of-16 at Fresno State (Feb. 21) with five different players hitting a trey. UH ranks first in conference and 29th in the country in 3-point field goal percentage at 36.5 percent.

Crashing the Boards

Rebounding has been one of the keys to UH's success thus far. Hawaii has out-rebounded 21 of 27 opponents and are 19-2 when holding an advantage on the boards. The Wahine currently rank second in the WAC and 18th in the nation in rebound margin at +7.3. Junior center **Christen Roper** (7.4 rpg) and sophomore guard **April Atuaia** (6.4 rpg) led the way on the glass.

Winning at the Line

UH has made a living on the line, where the Rainbow Wahine have nearly doubled the amount of free throw attempts of their opponents. UH has gone to the line 601 times, an average of 23.1 per game. Their opponents meanwhile have averaged 13.0 attempts per game. The Rainbow Wahine have in fact made more free throws than their opponents have attempted (413-339). They have also continued to stay out of foul trouble, with only five disqualifications this season and six in the last 61 games.

Return to Sender

Junior **Christen Roper** has continued to dominate the paint defensively. The 6-5 center, who set a school and conference single-season record of 96 blocks last season, is again putting up her best defense with 68 blocks through 27 games. Her 2.5 bpg ranks second in conference and ninth in the nation. She already tied a school-record with seven blocks in the season-opener vs. Washington State (Nov. 17) and became the school's all-time leader in blocked shots against Baylor (Dec. 7) five games later. While **Nani Cockett** (1994, '96-'98) set the mark of 140 in 120 career games, Roper shattered the record in just 62 contests. She now has a career total of 186.

Head Coach Vince Goo

Vince Goo is in his 15th season as head coach of the University of Hawai'i women's basketball team. With a 308-130 record, Goo is the winningest coach in Wahine basketball history.

Goo has brought the Wahine basketball program to unprecedented success, notching 20-plus win seasons in nine of the last 11 seasons. During his tenure, the Wahine have captured three regular-season conference titles and five NCAA Tournament and three WNIT bids.

In 1998 he was named the WAC Pacific Division Coach-of-the-Year after guiding the Wahine to the WAC Pacific Division title and an NCAA Tournament berth. He was also named Big West Coach-of-the-Year in 1989, '93 and '94.

The former high school teacher has also molded Wahine players into winners off the court. Goo boasts a 100 percent graduation rate among the more than 30 players who have completed their eligibility at UH. Last season, five Wahine made the WAC All-Academic Team.
