2002 Women's National Invitation Tournament Hawai'i (23-7, 14-4 WAC) at Oregon State (16-14, 11-7 PAC 10)

This Week

The Rainbow Wahine earned their third straight Women's National Invitation Tournament berth and will play at Oregon State on Thursday in opening round action of the 32-team tournament. Hawaii finished the regular season with a 23-7 overall record and advanced to the Western Athletic Conference Tournament championship. UH took No. 8 Louisiana Tech down to wire, but fell just shy of an automatic birth into the NCAA Tournament with a 53-50 loss to the Lady Techsters. UH advanced to last year's WNIT semifinals.

Homecoming For Wagner

Freshman **Chelsea Wagner** will be returning to her home state when the Rainbow Wahine face Oregon State. Wagner was named the high school player of the year last season while playing for Springfield High School, less than 40 miles from Corvallis. The 5-10 guard has started to shine in a starting role. Wagner was thrust into the starting slot following April Atuaia's injury against Fresno State on January 26. In 13 starts Wagner has been the team's leading scorer, averaging 12.3 ppg, while also adding 4.0 rpg and 1.5 apg. Wagner has particularly gotten it going from the outside. Against UTEP, she hit 5-of-10 on 3-pointers en route to a game-high 17 points. In UH's next game at Louisiana Tech she scored a game-high 18 points and set a new individual school record with 12 3-point attempts. She hit four of those attempts versus the Lady Techsters and has made 24 of her 33 3-pointers in 10 starts. Her 33 treys ties **Nani Cockett** (1993-94) for the freshman single-season record.

Gabrielova Closes in on 3-Point Record

Janka Gabrielova needs just two 3-pointers to set a new school single-season record. With 47 treys the senior point guard is within closing distance of **Kylie Page's** mark of 48 set during the 1997-98 season. She has 78 career treys, good for seventh on the school's all-time list. Gabrielova set a new single-season record for 3-point attempts on Saturday against Louisiana Tech, when she launched seven attempts to give her 127 for the season. She surpassed **BJ Itoman** and **Crystal Lee**, who shared the old record of 121 attempts.

Frequent Flyers

The Rainbow Wahine are making their third trip to the mainland in the past four week, their sixth since late December. UH has found itself in California, Nevada, Idaho, Utah, Arizona, Texas, Oregon, Oklahoma and Louisiana in a little more than two months time. The team has traveled some 39,601 miles during that span, equivalent to more than 1.5 times around the globe.

Got Balance?

Hawaii is showcasing one of its most balanced offensive attacks ever this season. Eight different players have scored in double figures at least once this year, while seven different players have led the team in scoring. Two players are averaging in double figures this season led by **Natasja Allen's** 10.8 ppg. Seven players on the squad are averaging nearly six points or more with only an average of 4.6 points separating the team's top scorer and the seventh leading scorer.

All-WAC Honors

Seniors point guard **Janka Gabrielova** was the sole Rainbow Wahine to earn all-conference honors when she was named to the all-WAC second team in a vote by conference coaches. The native of Bratislava, Slovakia led the team in conference scoring (10.2 ppg) and assists (4.7 apg), the latter stat good for fourth in the WAC. She is also the team leader in 3-pointers made (44) and free throw percentage (.802). Gabrielova was also named to the WAC all-tournament team. Junior center **Christen Roper** and freshman forward **Kim Willoughby** were also named all-tournament after helping lead the team to the championship game versus Louisiana Tech (Mar. 9).

Twentysomething

The Rainbow Wahine earned their 13th 20-win season in the program's history with a 66-48 win over UTEP February 28. Eleven of those seasons have come under current head coach **Vince Goo**. It also marked UH's third straight 20-win season and sixth in the last seven years. The Rainbow Wahine earned two NCAA Tournament and three WNIT bids in those six seasons.

Given the Green(y) Light

Senior wing player and team captain **Karena Greeny** is elevating her play as the season progresses. Entering conference play, Greeny was the team's fifth leading scorer at 7.6 ppg and was struggling with her 3-point shooting at 27 percent. Greeny turned it around, by leading the team in conference scoring (10.2), finishing second in rebounding (6.3) and hitting an amazing 52.4 percent of treys in WAC games. The Rainbow Wahine are 13-3 in their last 16 games and the native of Port Angeles, Wash., has averaged 11.3 ppg, 7.1 rpg and 1.7 apg during the stretch. She also averaged a team-high 11.3 ppg in the WAC Tournament last week to help lead the team to a championship game appearance. Greeny leads the team in minutes (31.3 mppg) and 3-point field goal percentage (.423) and is second on the team in double-doubles (3).

Tenacious D

The Wahine, among the national leaders in defense last season, are again putting the clamps down on their opponents. UH is allowing just 55.9 points per game (14th in the nation) and have held its opponents to just 34.5 percent shooting from the floor (7th in the nation). Just one opponent in the last 69 games has shot 50 percent against UH (New Mexico, March 24, 2001).

Clear Connection

UH have been lighting it up from the outside this season. The Rainbow Wahine set a new school record by nailing 15 3-pointers in an 89-66 win at UTEP (Feb. 4). Hawaii shattered the old mark of 11 set last season in a 72-66 overtime loss to TCU (Jan. 5, 2001). The 29 attempts against the Miners also tied a school-record set in 1999 in a 71-66 loss to New Mexico. In UH's next game against No. 7 Louisiana Tech, freshman **Chelsea Wagner** set a new individual school record with 12 3-point attempts. The Rainbow Wahine also made 8-of-16 at Fresno State (Feb. 21) with five different players hitting a trey. UH ranks first in conference and 37th in the country in 3-point field goal percentage at 35.4 percent.

Crashing the Boards

Rebounding has been one of the keys to UH's success thus far. Hawaii has out-rebounded 24 of 30 opponents and are 21-3 when holding an advantage on the boards. The Wahine currently rank second in the WAC and 14th in the nation in rebound margin at +7.5. Junior center **Christen Roper** (7.4 rpg) and sophomore guard **Karena Greeny** (6.2 rpg) led the way on the glass.

Winning at the Line

UH has made a living on the line, where the Rainbow Wahine have nearly doubled the amount of free throw attempts of their opponents. UH has gone to the line 643 times, an average of 21.4 per game. Their opponents meanwhile have averaged 12.0 attempts per game. The Rainbow Wahine have in fact made more free throws than their opponents have attempted (447-351). They have also continued to stay out of foul trouble, with only five disqualifications this season and six in the last 64 games.

Return to Sender

Junior **Christen Roper** has continued to dominate the paint defensively. The 6-5 center, who set a school and conference single-season record of 96 blocks last season, is again putting up her best defense with 73 blocks through 30 games. Her 2.4 bpg ranks second in conference and 14th in the nation. She already tied a school-record with seven blocks in the season-opener vs. Washington State (Nov. 17) and became the school's all-time leader in blocked shots against Baylor (Dec. 7) five games later. While **Nani Cockett** (1994, '96-98) set the mark of 140 in 120 career games, Roper shattered the record in just 62 contests. She now has a career total of 191.

Going Postal

Hawaii's opponents have found the going tough in the post. The Wahine frontcourt combination of **Natasja Allen** and **Christen Roper** have come up huge on both ends of the court. Allen is averaging a team-best 10.8 ppg and adding 5.8 rpg. Roper is third on the team with 9.6 ppg and is first in rebounds at 7.3 per game. Roper, who leads the team with five double-doubles, was named MVP of the Waikiki Beach Marriott Resort Classic and Ala Moana Hotel Paradise Classic after leading the Wahine to the championship. She was also named WAC Player of the Week on December 28. Allen, meanwhile, earned all-tournament honors in all four of UH's preseason tourneys and has scored in double figures in 19 of 30 games this year.

Protecting the Lead

A strength of the Wahine basketball team has been its ability to put teams away. The Wahine are 42-6 the last two seasons when leading at halftime, including a stellar 21-2 record this season. Conversely, the Wahine are 2-5 when trailing at halftime this year. UH lost its first halftime lead (21-16) of the year when it fell, 55-54, to Rice on February 17. UH's only other came came to No. 8 Louisiana Tech. The Rainbow Wahine led 28-21 at the break, but succumbed to the Lady Techsters, 53-50 in the WAC Tournament championship (Mar. 9).

Goo Captures 300th Career Victory

Head coach **Vince Goo** reached a milestone on Saturday, January 26, picking up his 300th career win with a 69-53 decision over Fresno State. Goo, who took over the reins at UH during the 1987-88 season, holds a 310-131 (.703) record in his 15th year as head coach. Goo picked up his 100th win on December 13, 1992 vs. Santa Clara and his 200th in a win over Rice in the quarterfinals of the WAC Tournament on March 5, 1997. Goo began this season with 287 wins. His teams have averaged 20.5 wins per season.

Injury Update

April Atuaia is out for the rest of the season with an ACL injury. She had missed nine of UH's last 10 games after suffering a torn left ACL in UH's 69-53 home win over Fresno State on January 26. The sophomore returned to action briefly at Fresno State (Feb. 21), logging in five minutes, but reaggravated her knee the next day in practice. Prior to her injury the reigning WAC Freshman of the Year proved to be the most versatile player on the team. She averaged 8.2 ppg and was second on the team in rebounds (7.1 rpg), assists (3.8 apg) and steals (13) through 16 games.

Home Sweet Home

Since moving into the Stan Sheriff Center in 1994, Hawaii has won 75 percent of its home games (110-36) and 79 percent of its conference games (51-13). The Wahine held an 11-game home win streak until falling to Stanford, November 24.

Road Warriors

The Wahine are 33-13 (.717) in Western Athletic Conference regular season road games since joining the league in 1996-97, including 7-2 this season.

Top-Notch Schedule

Hawaii faced three ranked teams during its regular season schedule and have hung tough against all of them. The Wahine lost its first matchup with a ranked team when it fell to **Stanford** (then AP No. 8, Coaches' No. 7), 71-60, in the semifinals of the Rainbow Wahine Classic. The Wahine trailed by as many as 19 in the game but went on a 21-0 run to go ahead of the Cardinal before the half. The game was knotted halfway through the second half, until Stanford pulled away. UH also presented a challenge for **Baylor** (then AP No. 9, Coaches' No. 13) in the Tesoro Invitational on Dec. 7. The Wahine trailed by just two points at half and led by as many as three points in the second half, before falling, 60-55. In a conference matchup up on January 13, UH lost to **Louisiana Tech** (then AP No. 11, Coaches' No. 13), 67-55. Before facing the Wahine, the Lady Techsters average margin of victory in the WAC was near 40 points. UH lost the rematch, 83-54, in Ruston, La., but nearly defeated the Lady Techsters in the WAC Tournament Championship, leading by as many as nine points in the second half before falling, 53-50.

Head Coach Vince Goo

Vince Goo is in his 15th season as head coach of the University of Hawai'i women's basketball team. With a 310-131 record, Goo is the winningest coach in Wahine basketball history.

Goo has brought the Wahine basketball program to unprecedented success, notching 20-plus win seasons in nine of the last 11 seasons. During his tenure, the Wahine have captured three regular-season conference titles and five NCAA Tournament and three WNIT bids.

In 1998 he was named the WAC Pacific Division Coach-of-the-Year after guiding the Wahine to the WAC Pacific Division title and an NCAA Tournament berth. He was also named Big West Coach-of-the-Year in 1989, '93 and '94.

The former high school teacher has also molded Wahine players into winners off the court. Goo boasts a 100 percent graduation rate among the more than 30 players who have completed their eligibility at UH. Last season, five Wahine made the WAC All-Academic Team.
