Hawai'i (8-2) vs. San Jose State (7-4) Wahine Return For WAC Home Opener

This Week

The University of Hawai'i Rainbow Wahine basketball team plays its first WAC home game of the season, hosting San Jose State Saturday at the Stan Sheriff Center. The Wahine opened conference play with a 61-48 win at Boise State on December 28, while travel difficulties prevented the squad from playing at UTEP on December 30. The Spartans, who are 2-0 in WAC play, upset the Wahine at the Sheriff Center last season, 74-72, breaking an 11-game losing streak against UH.

Hawaii-UTEP Game Postponed

The Hawaii-UTEP game scheduled for Sunday, December 30 was postponed due to inclement weather prohibiting the Wahine to travel to El Paso. Hawaii was en route to El Paso following a 61-48 win at Boise State, but winter storms in Salt Lake City, Utah prevented the team from catching a connecting flight to El Paso. The game has been rescheduled for February 4 at 7 p.m in El Paso.

Goo Closing in On 300

Head coach Vince Goo is nearing a milestone, needing only five more wins to reach 300 victories in his career. Goo, who took over the reins at UH during the 1987-88 season, holds a 295-126 (.701) in his 15th year as head coach. Goo picked up his 100th win on December 13, 1992 vs. Santa Clara and his 200th in a win over Rice in the quarterfinals of the WAC Tournament on March 5, 1997. Goo began the season with 287 wins. His teams have averaged 20.5 wins per season.

Winning at the Line

UH has made a living on the line, where the Wahine have nearly doubled the amount of free throw attempts of its opponents. UH has gone to the line 269 times in the first 10 games, an average of 26.9 per game. In UH's 82-59 win over Charlotte (Dec. 17) the Wahine converted on a season-high 28-of-44 free throws. Their opponents meanwhile have taken 138 foul shots, an average of 13.8 per game. The Wahine have continued to stay out of foul trouble, with only two disqualifications this season and three in the last 43 contests.

Roper Becomes Career Leader In Blocks

Junior center **Christen Roper** became the school's all-time leader in blocked shots during UH's 70-65 loss to Baylor on December 7. Entering the contest, Roper had 140 career blocks and trailed **Nani Cockett** (1994, '96-98) by just one on the all-time list. Roper finished the Baylor game with five blocks and now has 157 for her career. While Cockett set the mark in 120 career games, Roper shattered the mark in just 62 contests. The 6-5 center, who set a school and conference single-season record of 96 blocks last season, is on another record-setting pace with 39 blocks through 10 games. She already tied a school-record with seven blocks in the season-opener vs. Washington State (Nov. 17) and her 3.9 bpg ranks second in the nation (Dec. 17).

Tenacious D

The Wahine, among the national leaders in defense last season, are again putting the clamps down on their opponents. UH is allowing just 58.1 points per game and have held its opponents to just 33.7 percent shooting from the floor. UH held Cleveland State to just 17-of-71 shooting (24 percent) in its last non-conference outing. Even in defeat the Wahine put out a solid defensive effort. Stanford defeated UH 71-60, but shot just 39 percent and was held scoreless by the Wahine for more than 10 minutes in the first half.

Going Postal

Hawai'i's first 10 opponents have found the going tough in the post. The Wahine frontcourt combination of **Natasja Allen** and **Christen Roper** have come up huge on both ends of the court accounting for 41 percent of the team's scoring and 33 percent of the rebounding. Allen is averaging a team best 15.4 ppg and adding 6.5 rpg. Roper is second on the team with 12.8 ppg and is second in rebounds at 8.6 per game. Roper was named MVP of the Waikiki Beach Marriott Resort Classic and Ala Moana Hotel Paradise Classic after leading the Wahine to the championship. She was also named WAC Player of the Week on December 28. Allen, meanwhile, earned all-tournament honors in all four of UH's preseason tourneys and has scored in double figures in all 10 games this year.

Injury Update

Freshman forward **Jade Abele** has a stress fracture in her right foot and will be sidelined for 2-4 weeks.

Home Sweet Home

Since moving into the Stan Sheriff Center in 1994, Hawai'i has won 75 percent of its home games (103-34) and 80 percent of its conference games (44-11). The Wahine held an 11-game home win streak until falling to Stanford, November 24.

Road Warriors

The Wahine are 27-11 (.715) in Western Athletic Conference regular season road games since joining the league in 1996-97.

Top-Notch Schedule

Hawai'i will face up to three ranked teams during its regular season schedule and have already hung tough against its first two ranked foes. The Wahine lost its first matchup with a ranked team when it fell to Stanford (then AP No. 8, Coaches' No. 7), 71-60, in the semi-finals of the Rainbow Wahine Classic. The Wahine trailed by as many as 19 in the game but went on a 21-0 run to go ahead of the Cardinal before the half. The game was knotted halfway through the second half, until Stanford pulled away. UH also presented a challenge for Baylor (then AP No. 9, Coaches' No. 13) in the Tesoro Invitational on Dec. 7. The Wahine trailed by just two points at half and led by as many as three points in the second half, before falling, 60-55. Louisiana Tech (AP No. 11, Coaches' No. 10) looms in conference play on January 13 (home) and February 7th (away).

Up Next

Hawai'i hosts SMU on Friday, January 11 at 7 p.m. and conference preseason favorite Louisiana Tech on Sunday, January 13 at 5 p.m. The game against the Lady Techsters will be preceded by the annual alumnae game at 3 p.m.

Scouting San Jose State

The Spartans (7-4) will be playing their third straight on the road to open conference play...they have already won their first two on the road at UTEP (73-48) and Boise State (85-74 in OT)...the Spartans, who are on a three-game win streak, own a 5-2 road record so far this season...San Jose State is led by the backcourt of point guard **Cricket Williams** (17.2 ppg, 4.7 apg) and **Atari Parker** (14.1 ppg, 5.7 rpg)...the Spartans were picked to finish tied for last in the preseason coaches poll...head coach **Janice Richard** is in her second season at San Jose State and has a 20-20 school and 182-78 career record in her ninth year.

Series History

Hawai'i leads the series 29-5 and has won 12 of the last 13 meetings. The Wahine won at San Jose State, 91-61, in the last meeting on February 23, 2001.

Recapping Boise State

BOISE, Idaho-The University of Hawaii Wahine basketball team hit the road for the first time this season and came out a 61-48 winner over Boise State before 1,015 Friday at The Pavilion. UH used a stalwart defensive effort to win their conference opener and spoil the Broncos WAC debut.

In the first-ever meeting between the teams, Hawaii (8-2, 1-0 WAC) held Boise State to 48 points, a season low point total for Wahine opponents. Boise State (4-7, 0-1) missed its first nine attempts of the game and shot just 34 percent for the game, including 3-of-18 from behind the arc. UH also out-rebounded the Broncos 46-32 and were led by **April Atuaia** who had a career-high 16 boards.

Both teams came out sluggish, combining to miss 12 of their first 13 shots. The Wahine however got into gear first and scored the game's first eight points. The Broncos went scoreless for the first six minutes but eventually went on an 11-0 run to take the lead. UH however weathered the storm and led 22-18 at the break.

The Wahine never trailed in the second half, and sealed the game on the free throw line, where they finished 16-of-19 (84 percent). The Broncos on the other hand went to line just five times.

Natasja Allen led the team with 15 points, her tenth straight game in double digits. **Christen Roper** added 12 and **Karena Greeny** 10. **Christa Peterson** led Boise State with 24 points.

Head Coach Vince Goo

Vince Goo is in his 15th season as head coach of the University of Hawai'i women's basketball team. With a 295-126 record, Goo is the winningest coach in Wahine basketball history.

Goo has brought the Wahine basketball program to unprecedented success, notching 20-plus win seasons in eight of the last 10 seasons. During his tenure, the Wahine have captured three regular-season conference titles and five NCAA Tournament and three WNIT bids.

In 1998 he was named the WAC Pacific Division Coach-of-the-Year after guiding the Wahine to the WAC Pacific Division title and an NCAA Tournament berth. He was also named Big West Coach-of-the-Year in 1989, '93 and '94.

The former high school teacher has also molded Wahine players into winners off the court. Goo boasts a 100 percent graduation rate among the more than 30 players who have completed their eligibility at UH. Last season, five Wahine made the WAC All-Academic Team.
