## Final Release

### Hawai'i (23-8, 14-4 WAC) Ends Season With Third Straight WNIT Appearance

#### Season Review

The 2001-02 University of Hawaii Rainbow Wahine basketball team kept the program's winning tradition alive. For UH it was its third straight second place finish in the WAC, its third straight 20-win season and its third straight post-season appearance. Hawaii lacked star power but instead relied on perhaps the best team effort in school history. With three of the top scorers gone from the 2000-01 squad that went 26-8, questions loomed over who would lead the team offensively. The answer was not a single player but a group of players who could lead the team in any given game. UH sported a balanced attack with its leading scorer averaging just 10.4 ppg. UH also played solid team defense, finishing among the top teams nationally in scoring defense, field goal percentage defense and rebounding margin.

Post players **Natasja Allen** and **Christen Roper** carried the team early in the season as UH captured two of its four preseason tournaments. The squad got a boost near the end of the preseason when All-American volleyball player **Kim Willoughby** donned a basketball jersey. With freshman forward **Jade Abele** sidelined with a foot injury, Willoughby stepped right in and became the team's top post reserve.

UH finished the preseason 7-2, with its only losses to nationally-ranked Stanford and Baylor. UH entered WAC play winning three in a row and extended its streak to a season-long six games with victories over Boise State, San Jose State and SMU. A home loss to WAC newcomer Louisiana Tech ended the streak and gave UH three losses--all to top-ten teams. Its first loss to an unranked foe came at Rice the very next game.

Mid-season brought a milestone when head coach **Vince Goo** picked up his 300th career win when UH defeated Fresno State on January 26. The game however was marred with injury as April Atuaia suffered a torn left ACL just three minutes into the game and was lost for the season. Atuaia's injury however opened the door for freshman **Chelsea Wagner** who became the team's top scorer in the final half of the season. Wagner, along with point guard **Janka Gabrielova** (second team all-WAC) and wing **Karena Greeny** became the focal point, leading the team in its final push.

UH ended the WAC regular season in a tie for second place with Rice and received the the third seed at the WAC Tournament in Tulsa, Okla. Hawaii made a repeat appearance in the championship game with wins over Nevada and Rice and entered its matchup with top-seed La Tech on a six-game win streak. UH nearly pulled the upset, leading by as many as nine in the second half, but eventually fell, 53-50.

Despite its 23 wins and courageous showing in the WAC championship, Hawaii suffered NCAA disappointment for the second straight year and were not invited to the "Big Dance." For the third straight season the Rainbow Wahine earned a berth to the Women's National Invitation Tournament. Unlike last year's magical run, UH opened the tournament on the road and fell to Oregon State in the first round, 62-50.

Twentysomething

The Rainbow Wahine finished 23-8 to give them their 13th 20-win season in program history. Eleven of those seasons have come under current head coach **Vince Goo**. It also marks UH's third straight 20-win season and sixth in the last seven years. The Rainbow Wahine earned two NCAA Tournament and three WNIT bids in those six seasons.

Gabrielova Breaks 3-Point Record

**Janka Gabrielova** set a new single-season 3-point record with 49 treys this season. She surpassed **Kylie Page's** mark of 48 (set during the 1997-98 season) in the final game of the season when she drained two 3-pointers in UH's loss at Oregon State (Mar. 14). Gabrielova also holds the single-season record for 3-point attempts with 133 for the year, a record she set in the WAC Tournament championship versus Louisiana Tech. The senior point guard finished her two-year career with 80 treys, good for seventh on the school's all-time list and a 36.2 percentage, good for fifth.

Frequent Flyers

The Rainbow Wahine made six trips to the mainland since late December and found itself in California, Nevada, Idaho, Utah, Arizona, Illinois, Texas, Oregon, Oklahoma and Louisiana in a little more than two months time. The team has traveled some 42,884 miles during that span, equivalent to almost two trips around the globe.

Got Balance?

Hawaii showcased perhaps its most balanced offensive attack ever this season. Eight different players scored in double figures at least once this year, while seven different players led the team in scoring. Two players finished in double figures this season led by Natasja Allen's 10.4 ppg. Seven players on the squad averaged nearly six points or more with only an average of 4.3 points separating the team's top scorer and the seventh leading scorer.

All-WAC Honors

Senior point guard **Janka Gabrielova** was the sole Rainbow Wahine to earn all-conference honors when she was named to the all-WAC second team on March 3 in a vote by conference coaches. The native of Bratislava, Slovakia led the team in conference scoring (10.2 ppg) and assists (4.7 apg), the latter stat good for fourth in the WAC. She also finished as the overall leader in free throw percentage (.806). Gabrielova was also named to the WAC all-tournament team. Junior center **Christen Roper** and freshman forward **Kim Willoughby** were also named all-tournament after helping lead the team to the championship game versus Louisiana Tech (Mar. 9).

Aloha Seniors

Seniors **Janka Gabrielova** and **Karena Greeny** closed their careers as Rainbow Wahine. Gabrielova earned the starting point guard spot upon her arrival from Weatherford (Texas) College two years ago and led UH to a 49-14 record, while starting all 65 games she appeared in. An all-WAC newcomer last year, she earned all-WAC second-team honors this season, averaging 10.2 ppg and 4.3 apg, good for fourth in the WAC. Her 49 3-pointers set a new school single-season record. Greeny, who had been in the program for five seasons, enjoyed her best season as a Rainbow Wahine. She earned team captain honors as the season began and has put up career numbers in every statistical category this season. The native of Port Angeles, Wash., averaged 9.5 ppg and 6.1 rpg and was second on the team with three double-doubles this season. Greeny turned up her play as the season progressed and was the team's leading scorer in WAC play (10.2 ppg), as well the WAC's most accurate 3-point shooter (.425). The 5-11 forward also leads the team in minutes at 31.4 per game.

Fantastic Frosh

A year after **April Atuaia** earned conference freshman of the year honors, the Rainbow Wahine got another impact season from a true freshman. **Chelsea Wagner** learned the ropes early, but by the end of the season became the team's top offensive threat. The 5-10 guard started the first half of the season as a reserve and averaged just 4.9 ppg while playing 14.0 minutes per game. Wagner was thrust into the starting slot following Atuaia's ACL injury against Fresno State on January 26. Starting the final 14 games of the season, Wagner was the team's leading scorer, averaging 12.6 ppg, while also adding 4.1 rpg and 1.4 apg. Wagner became the team's most dan-

gerous shooter and finished second on the squad with 37 treys--a new freshman single-season record. Her fearless play came on display when she launched a school-record 12 3-point attempts en route to a game-high 18 points at Louisiana Tech (Feb. 7). She capped her season by having an solid outing in the WNIT first round game at Oregon State. Returning to the state where she named the high school player of the year last season, Wagner led UH in scoring with 16 points and nailed four second-half treys to help mount a second half comeback. Wagner finished the year averaging 8.6 ppg, 3.2 rpg and 1.1 apg.

### Tenacious D

The Rainbow Wahine have built a reputation for strong defense and this season was no different as UH put the clamps down on their opponents. UH allowed just 56.1 points per game (14th in the nation as of Mar. 11) and held its opponents to just 34.6 percent shooting from the floor (7th in the nation as of Mar. 11). Just one opponent in the last 70 games has shot 50 percent against UH (New Mexico, March 24, 2001).

### Winning at the Line

Another trademark of Wahine basketball is frequent trips to the foul line. UH dominated their foes again, going to the line 651 times, an average of 21.0 per game. Their opponents meanwhile averaged 12.2 attempts per game as the Rainbow Wahine made more free throws than their opponents attempted (454-377). They also continued to stay out of foul trouble, with only five disqualifications this season and six in the last 65 games.

### Clear Connection

UH lit it up from the outside this season. The Rainbow Wahine set a new school record by nailing 15 3-pointers in an 89-66 win at UTEP (Feb. 4). Hawaii shattered the old mark of 11 set last season in a 72-66 overtime loss to TCU (Jan. 5, 2001). The 29 attempts against the Miners also tied a school-record set in 1999 in a 71-66 loss to New Mexico. In UH's next game against No. 7 Louisiana Tech, freshman **Chelsea Wagner** set a new individual school record with 12 3-point attempts. The Rainbow Wahine also made 8-of-16 at Fresno State (Feb. 21) with five different players hitting a trey. UH finished first in conference and in 3-point field goal percentage at 35.3 percent and the 151 3-pointers is the second-most in school history.

### Crashing the Boards

Rebounding has been one of the keys to UH's success thus far. Hawaii out-rebounded 25 of 31 opponents this season and were 21-4 when holding an advantage on the boards. The Wahine finished second in the WAC and 14th in the nation in rebound margin at +7.4 and were the the top team in the conference in rebounding defense (35.2). Junior center **Christen Roper** (7.4 rpg) led the way on the glass for UH.

## Return to Sender

Junior **Christen Roper** continued her defensive dominance this season. The 6-5 center, who set a school and conference single-season record of 96 blocks last season, put up her best defense with 75 blocks this year. Her 2.4 bpg ranked second in conference and 14th in the nation (as of Mar. 11). She tied a school-record with seven blocks in the season-opener vs. Washington State (Nov. 17) and became the school's all-time leader in blocked shots against Baylor (Dec. 7) five games later. While **Nani Cockett** (1994, '96-'98) set the mark of 140 in 120 career games, Roper shattered the record in just 62 contests. She now has a career total of 193.

## Going Postal

Hawaii's opponents found the going tough in the post. The Wahine frontcourt combination of **Natasja Allen** and **Christen Roper** came up huge on both ends of the court. Allen finished as the team's leading scorer at 10.4 ppg and added 5.8 rpg. Roper finished third on the team with 9.5 ppg and first in rebounds at 7.3 per game. The tandem were particularly unstoppable during the preseason. Roper, who led the team with five double-doubles, was named MVP of the Waikiki Beach Marriott Resort Classic and Ala Moana Hotel Paradise Classic after leading the Wahine to both championships. She was also named WAC Player of the Week on December 28. Allen, meanwhile, earned all-tournament honors in all four of UH's preseason tourneys and has scored in double figures the first 10 games of the season.

## Protecting the Lead

A strength of the Wahine basketball team has been its ability to put teams away. The Wahine are 42-6 the last two seasons when leading at halftime, including a stellar 21-2 record this season. Conversely, the Wahine were 2-6 when trailing at halftime this year. UH lost its first halftime lead (21-16) of the year when it fell, 55-54, to Rice on February 17. UH's only other loss came to No. 8 Louisiana Tech. The Rainbow Wahine led 28-21 at the break, but succumbed to the Lady Techsters, 53-50 in the WAC Tournament championship (Mar. 9).

## Goo Captures 300th Career Victory

Head coach **Vince Goo** reached a milestone on Saturday, January 26, picking up his 300th career win with a 69-53 decision over Fresno State. Goo, who took over the reins at UH during the 1987-88 season, holds a 310-132 (.701) record in his 15th year as head coach. Goo picked up his 100th win on December 13, 1992 vs. Santa Clara and his 200th in a win over Rice in the quarterfinals of the WAC Tournament on March 5, 1997. Goo began this season with 287 wins. His teams have averaged 20.7 wins per season.

## Home Sweet Home

Since moving into the Stan Sheriff Center in 1994, Hawaii has won 75 percent of its home games (110-36) and 79 percent of its conference games (51-13). The Wahine held an 11-game home win streak until falling to Stanford, November 24.

## Road Warriors

The Wahine are 33-13 (.717) in Western Athletic Conference regular season road games since joining the league in 1996-97 and finished 7-2 this season.

## Top-Notch Schedule

Hawaii faced three ranked teams during its regular season schedule and hung tough against all of them. The Rainbow Wahine lost its first matchup with a ranked team when it fell to **Stanford** (then AP No. 8, Coaches' No. 7), 71-60, in the semifinals of the Rainbow Wahine Classic. The Wahine trailed by as many as 19 in the game but went on a 21-0 run to go ahead of the Cardinal before the half. The game was knotted halfway through the second half, until Stanford pulled away. UH also presented a challenge for **Baylor** (then AP No. 9, Coaches' No. 13) in the Tesoro Invitational on Dec. 7. The Wahine trailed by just two points at half and led by as many as three points in the second half, before falling, 60-55. In a conference matchup up on January 13, UH lost to **Louisiana Tech** (then AP No. 11, Coaches' No. 13), 67-55. Before facing the Wahine, the Lady Techsters average margin of victory in the WAC was near 40 points. UH lost the rematch, 83-54, in Ruston, La., but nearly defeated the Lady Techsters in the WAC Tournament Championship, leading by as many as nine points in the second half before falling, 53-50.

## Head Coach Vince Goo

Vince Goo completed his 15th season as head coach of the University of Hawai'i women's basketball team, guiding his squad to its third straight 20-win season and post-season berth. With a 310-132 record, Goo is the winningest coach in Wahine basketball history.

Goo has brought the Wahine basketball program to unprecedented success, notching 20-plus win seasons in nine of the last 11 seasons. During his tenure, the Wahine have captured three regular-season conference titles and five NCAA Tournament and four WNIT bids.

In 1998 he was named the WAC Pacific Division Coach-of-the-Year after guiding the Wahine to the WAC Pacific Division title and an NCAA Tournament berth. He was also named Big West Coach-of-the-Year in 1989, '93 and '94.

The former high school teacher has also molded Wahine players into winners off the court. Goo boasts a 100 percent graduation rate among the more than 30 players who have completed their eligibility at UH. Last season, five Wahine made the WAC All-Academic Team.
