Wahine Host San Jose State/Fresno State This Week; Attendance Mark to be Broken on Saturday

After playing five of its last six matches on the road, including the last four in Texas, the University of Hawai'i women's volleyball team returns this week to the Stan Sheriff Center to play host to San Jose State, Nov. 2 and Fresno State, Nov. 4. The second-ranked Rainbow Wahine are a perfect 20-0, 10-0 in the Western Athletic Conference.

Hawai'i has dominated the all-time series between the schools holding a 39-4 record over SJSU and an unblemished 24-0 mark against FSU.

The Spartans (17-5, 8-1 WAC) enter this Thursday's match in second place, behind the Wahine in the WAC standings. SJSU has won seven straight league matches and are led by last season's co-WAC player of the year, Joslynn Gallop. In her last match, Gallop became the league's all-time kill leader surpassing Fresno State's Tricia Tuley (1,804).

Fresno State enters this weekend at 12-11, 5-4 WAC. Head coach Lindy Vivas returns to the islands, where she once starred for Punahou School.

UH to Eclipse 100,000 Attendance Mark this Weekend

With two home matches this weekend, UH will eclipse the 100,000 mark in total attendance for the sixth consecutive year. Currently, the Wahine have drawn 89,711 through 13 matches. Hawai'i is the only school to reach the 100,000 mark. They lead the nation in attendance (6,901) and will likely hold that honor for the seventh consecutive year.

Turning 20 Again

UH's three-game victory over SMU on Saturday marked the Wahine's 20th victory this season. They have reached that figure 22 times under head coach Dave Shoji, including seven straight since 1994.

Wahine Remain Unbeaten

After week 10 of the regular season, the Rainbow Wahine remain one of just two teams with a perfect record. Only No. 1 Nebraska (21-0) owns a better record than the 20-0 Wahine. But starting the season undefeated is nothing new to Hawai'i. Last season, UH won its first 17 matches before falling to Stanford. In 1995, Hawai'i went almost the whole season (31), before suffering its first loss. And the following year, the Wahine started 23-0, en route to an NCAA Championship appearance.

No. 1 Again!!!

For the first time since the 1996 season, the Rainbow Wahine find themselves atop one of the two major volleyball polls. *Volleyball Magazine* has listed the Wahine atop its poll for the third straight week. Nebraska is ranked second followed by Arizona, USC, Wisconsin. In the AVCA/USA Today Coaches' Poll, the Wahine remain in second behind Nebraska.

UH First in Second West Region Poll

For the second straight week, Hawai'i tops the West Region poll (formerly District VII), released Oct. 18 by the NCAA. The district is comprised of schools from the Western Athletic, Big West, and Mountain West conferences. Colorado State, Pacific, UC Santa Barbara, Utah, Brigham Young, Long Beach State, Utah State, Cal Poly, and San Jose State round out the list. The list is conducted by the NCAA Division I Women's Volleyball Committee.

33 and Counting

After sweeping UTEP and Rice over the weekend, the Rainbow Wahine extended their current WAC regular season win streak to 33 matches. Hawai'i has won all 10 conference matches this season, including all 14 last season, and the final nine of the 1998 season. From Nov. 11, 1994 to Oct. 9, 1998, the Wahine had won 58 straight Big West and WAC matches, a streak which ranks eighth all-time in NCAA history. In their last 92 regular season conference matches, UH is 91-1.

Lily Blossoms

Through nearly two seasons at UH, sophomore Lily Kahumoku has proven herself as one of the top players in the country. As a freshman, the 6-foot-2 Lubbock, Texas native averaged 3.31 kills per game and hit .291. This season she has improved on those numbers, averaging a team-high 4.71 kpg, hitting .344. Kahumoku has led the team in kills in 14 matches and has hit in double-figures in all but one match.

Sudduth Eyes UH Record Book

Senior Jessica Sudduth's four-year career at Hawai'i has been highlighted with awards and recognition. Add to that her name on the UH career record book. She ranks among the very best Wahine in kill attempts (8th), service aces (6th), service aces per game (10th), and digs per game (10th). Sudduth also needs just 10 kills and 47 digs to crack the Top 10 in those categories.

Oh Maja...

Freshman Maja Gustin has had no problems adjusting to the American style of volleyball. Just a few months removed from starring on the Slovenian National Team, the 6-foot-3 middle hitter has contributed immediately to the Rainbow Wahine. She is averaging 2.56 kills per game and a WAC-best 1.68 blocking average. She also has served up a team-high 25 aces, which places her tied for third in the conference.

The Ragin' Cajun

Regarded by many as one of the top high school recruits in the country last year, Louisiana native Kim Willoughby has lived up to that billing. A starter for the second-ranked Rainbow Wahine, Willoughby is averaging 2.95 kills and a team-high 2.80 digs per game playing at right-side hitter. Last weekend, she substituted for an injured Lily Kahumoku at left-side hitter, and posted 26 kills (4.33 kpg) and 25 digs (4.17), and hit .373.

.300 or Better

Hawai'i has hit over .300 in 13-of-20 matches this season, including eight-of-10 WAC matches. The Wahine lead the WAC with a .305 team hitting percentage and a .325 mark in conference play. Four players are listed among the Top 15 in the WAC rankings.

Carey-ing Hawai'i to the Top

The Wahine are in good hands with setter Jennifer Carey. With one full season under her belt, Carey has directed the Wahine to an unblemished record and a healthy .305 team hitting percentage. In UH's four-set victory over UC Santa Barbara, Carey dished out 61 assists, just two shy of her personal best. She also had 59 assists in the Wahine's season opening win over Texas A&M and had 109 in UH's two-match sweep of Pepperdine.

Head Coach Dave Shoji

In the annals of collegiate women's volleyball history, University of Hawai'i head coach Dave Shoji stands among the best in the business.

Midway through his 25th season as head coach at UH in 1999, Shoji added to his extensive list of accomplishments: the Wahine gave Shoji his 700th career victory in a win at Fresno State. He became just the seventh coach in collegiate women's volleyball history to reach that milestone. It also places him third among active coaches in wins and fourth in winning percentage (.839). Among his many other accomplishments are winning four national championships, earning five conference coach of the year honors, and coaching four Olympians.

The Wahine dynasty began in 1975, when Shoji took over the program from Alan Kang. More than a quarter-century later, Wahine Volleyball is recognized as a powerhouse in the collegiate game.

Under Shoji, Wahine Volleyball has finished the season ranked in the Top 10 in 15 of 18 years including 11 times in the Top 5. Shoji has directed his teams to 25 consecutive winning seasons and has guided them to post-season play in all but one year.

His teams won national championships in 1979, 1982, 83, & 87. The 1982-83 teams became the first to repeat as NCAA champions.

About the San Jose State Spartans (17-5, 8-1 WAC)

Since a three-game setback to the Wahine on Sept. 30, the Spartans have won seven straight to improve to 8-1 in conference play. Middle blocker **JOSLYNN GALLOP** (6-1, Sr., Roseburg, OR), last season's co-WAC player of the year, is the backbone of the Spartan offense. She boasts a WAC-leading 5.80 kill average along with a .304 hitting percentage, 2.79 dig average and 0.94 blocking average, all of which ranks her in the Top 15 of the league. Three-year starter **BRIANNA BLAIR** (5-10, Jr., Tempe, AZ) is averaging 3.88 kills and 2.04 digs per game this season. Running the offense is junior **SAVANNAH SMITH** (5-8, S, Salem, OR). A back-up the past two seasons, Smith is averaging 13.34 assists, leading the Spartans to a team hitting percentage of .241. Head coach **CRAIG CHOATE** is in his eighth year at SJSU (143-99). Last year he earned WAC coach of the year honors after leading the Spartans to a 25-6 record and second place conference finish.

About the Fresno State Bulldogs (12-11, 5-4 WAC)

Fresno State has won five of its last eight WAC matches to move into fourth place in the conference standings. Anchoring the middle are **SHAUNA MCQUAID** (6-1, Jr., San Diego, CA) and **LINDSAY CLOSS** (6-1, So., Spokane, WA). McQuaid is the team's leading attacker, averaging 3.79 kills per game and hitting .307, while Closs is the team's top blocker averaging 1.14 per game and 2.87 kills per game. The setting duties have been shared by freshman **CHELSEY DULEY** (5-9, Tollhouse, CA) and sophomore **BRITTNEY PEARSON** (5-10, Sanger, CA). In WAC play, Pearson has received the starting nod, while Duley saw her first action in last week's loss to San Jose State.
