Wahine Host Nevada on Thursday, UH Clinches Share of WAC Title

With the help of UTEP's stunning upset over San Jose State on Friday, the University of Hawai'i secured themselves at least a share of the Western Athletic Conference title for the third consecutive year. At 13-0 in league play, the second-ranked Rainbow Wahine have three remaining WAC matches all at home in the Stan Sheriff Center.

The Wahine have a chance for the outright title with a victory over Nevada on Thursday, Nov. 16. The Wolf Pack is the only WAC team to take a game from the Wahine. Nevada took the second set during UH's four-game victory in Reno on Oct. 14.

Since joining the WAC in 1996, the Wahine has captured every regular season title. This year, as well as last, the league will not hold a postseason tournament meaning the regular season winner is considered the overall champion and receives the conference's automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament.

Hawai'i has won their last eight matches in straight sets and 18-of-23 overall. The Wahine hold a 9-1 all-time advantage over the Wolf Pack.

Hawai'i Eclipses 100,000

For the sixth consecutive year, Hawai'i eclipsed the 100,000 mark in total attendance. Through 15 home matches, the Wahine have drawn 102,871 for an average of 6,858 per contest. Hawai'i is the only school to reach the 100,000 plateau in a season. The Wahine currently lead the country in average attendance and will likely hold that position for the seventh straight year.

Wahine Off to Best Start Since 1996

After Week 12 of the regular season, the Rainbow Wahine remain one of just two teams with a perfect record. Only No. 1 Nebraska (24-0) owns a better record than the 23-0 Wahine. But starting the season undefeated is nothing new to Hawai'i. Last season, UH won its first 17 matches before falling to Stanford. In 1995, Hawai'i went almost the whole season (31), before suffering its first loss. And the following year, the Wahine started 23-0, en route to an NCAA Championship appearance.

No. 1 Again!!!

For the first time since the 1996 season, the Rainbow Wahine find themselves atop one of the two major volleyball polls. *Volleyball Magazine* has listed the Wahine atop its poll for the fifth straight week. Nebraska is ranked second followed by Colorado State, Pacific, and USC. In the AVCA/USA Today Coaches' Poll, the Wahine remain in second behind Nebraska.

UH Tops West Region

In the third West Region (formerly District VII) poll released by the NCAA, Hawai'i tops the district comprised of schools from the Western Athletic, Big West, and Mountain West conferences. Pacific, Colorado State, UC Santa Barbara, Brigham Young, Utah, Utah State, Long Beach State, Cal Poly, and San Jose State round out the list. The list is conducted by the NCAA Division I Women's Volleyball Committee and is used to determine the seedings in the 64-team tournament field.

36 and Counting

With a three-game victory over Tulsa, the Rainbow Wahine extended their current WAC regular season win streak to 36 matches. Hawai'i has won all 13 conference matches this season, including all 14 last season, and the final nine of the 1998 season. From Nov. 11, 1994 to Oct. 9, 1998, the Wahine had won 58 straight Big West and WAC matches, a streak which ranks eighth all-time in NCAA history. In their last 95 regular season conference matches, UH is 94-1.

Three and Out

The Wahine have dominated their opponents for much of this season. Of UH's 23 matches, only five times were they extended past three games. They have won their last eight matches and 12-of-13 WAC contests in straight sets.

Lily Blossoms

Through nearly two seasons at UH, sophomore Lily Kahumoku has proven herself as one of the top players in the country. As a freshman, the 6-foot-2 Lubbock, Texas native averaged 3.31 kills per game and hit .291. This season she has improved on those numbers, averaging a team-high 4.64 kpg, hitting .339. Kahumoku has led the team in kills in 15 matches and has surpassed the 20-kill mark four times.

Sudduth Eyes UH Record Book

Senior Jessica Sudduth's four-year career at Hawai'i has been highlighted with awards and recognition. Add to that her name on the UH career record book. She ranks among the very best Wahine in kill attempts (7th), service aces (6th), service aces per game (10th), and digs per game (10th). Sudduth's eight kills against Fresno State on Nov. 4, enabled her to crack the Top 10 list in career kills. She also needs just 26 digs to place 10th in that category.

Maja, How Much You've Learned

Freshman Maja Gustin, a freshman in class standing, but a veteran of the international game, has helped Hawai'i to an undefeated mark this season. The former Slovenian National Team member along with junior Veronica Lima form an intimidating middle attack for the Rainbow Wahine. Last week, Gustin earned WAC player of the week honors after leading the Wahine to wins over San Jose State and Fresno State. On the year, she is averaging 2.71 kills and 1.67 blocks per game.

The Ragin' Cajun

Considered one of the top high school seniors in the country last year, Louisiana native Kim Willoughby jumped right into the Wahine starting lineup this season. Playing at right-side hitter, Willoughby is averaging 2.97 kills and a team-high 2.86 digs per game. When Lily Kahumoku sat out two matches to nurse a wrist injury, Willoughby shifted to the left-side and the team did not miss a beat. She has posted five double-doubles this season and eight matches with double-figure kill totals.

.300 or Better

Hawai'i has hit over .300 in 13 matches this season, including 8-of-13 WAC matches. The Wahine lead the WAC with a .300 team hitting percentage and a .310 mark in conference play.

Carey-ing Hawai'i to the Top

The Wahine are in good hands with setter Jennifer Carey. With one full season under her belt, Carey has directed the Wahine to an unblemished record and a healthy .300 team hitting percentage, which ranks sixth in the country. In UH's four-set victory over UC Santa Barbara, Carey dished out 61 assists, just two shy of her personal best.

Head Coach Dave Shoji

In the annals of collegiate women's volleyball history, University of Hawai'i head coach Dave Shoji stands among the best in the business.

Midway through his 25th season as head coach at UH in 1999, Shoji added to his extensive list of accomplishments: the Wahine gave Shoji his 700th career victory in a win at Fresno State. He became just the seventh coach in collegiate women's volleyball history to reach that milestone. It also places him third among active coaches in wins and fourth in winning percentage (.839). Among his many other accomplishments are winning four national championships, earning five conference coach of the year honors, and coaching four Olympians.

The Wahine dynasty began in 1975, when Shoji took over the program from Alan Kang. More than a quarter-century later, Wahine Volleyball is recognized as a powerhouse in the collegiate game.

Under Shoji, Wahine Volleyball has finished the season ranked in the Top 10 in 15 of 18 years including 11 times in the Top 5. Shoji has directed his teams to 25 consecutive winning seasons and has guided them to post-season play in all but one year.

His teams won national championships in 1979, 1982, 83, & 87. The 1982-83 teams became the first to repeat as NCAA champions.

About the Nevada Wolf Pack (13-12, 10-4 WAC)

The Wolf Pack have assured themselves no lower than a third place finish in their inaugural season in the WAC. The Wolf Pack struggled to a 2-7 start to begin the season but has since won six of their last eight. Considered possibly the best defender in Nevada volleyball history, outside hitter **SUZANNE STONEBARGER** (5-9, Jr., Linden, CA) leads the conference in digs, averaging 4.06 per game. She is also the team's second leading attacker (3.15 kpg). Middle blocker **MICHELLE MORE** (6-1, So., Del Mar, CA) has a team-high 3.36 kill average and ranks fifth in the WAC in blocking (1.22 bpg). The Wolf Pack have alternated setters with **JENNIFER HARRIS** (5-10, Jr., San Jose, CA) receiving much of the playing time. Head coach **DEVIN SCRUGGS** has compiled a 57-46 mark in her fourth season at Nevada. She directed the Wolf Pack to the NCAA Tournament in 1998.
